The implementation of the centralised operational framework promppted and evaluation of governing boards structure and function. This board, dedicated to ensuring compliance, is poised to transition it's focus from day-today operations, to becoming а representative voice Triathlon Australia. particulary those centred around shaping the sports strategic direction.

Triathlon NT extends sincere gratitude to the NT Government, notably the Sport, Recreation and Strategic Infrstructure division, for their valuable parternship throughout the transition to the new centralised model. Their guidence has been instrumental in navigating this phase. The Triathlon community in the NT owes much of it's success to the unwavering dedication of our affiliated clubs. Darwin Tri Club, Katherine Multi sport club, and Alice Springs Tri Club. These clubs consistently organised high quality events that rival those in other regions, all while maintaining accessible pricing. The volunteer workforce behind these events deserves special recognition.

We extend our heartfelt appreciation to Presidents Patch Clapp, Brett Barney, and Megan Scott, along with their respective committees, for their tireless efforts in driving successful events throughout the year.

This years achievements are a testament to the dedication of the members in our triathlon community. We commend Lucy Berk the State Services Manager for her commitment to providing inclusive opportunites for all interested in triathlon. Our coaches, technical officials, volunteers, parents and athletes played a pivotal role in ensuring the sports continued success. ### FROM THE STATE SERVICES MANAGER

2022/2023 was the first year heading in a new direction with many exciting opportunities for the NT.

The first year in the new unified operating model with improved systems, greater support from a National team for effective and efficient delivery in the NT.

The first year we ran the Mov3 program without government funding.

The community value the program so much and wanted to see it continue as it emcompasses all our values. Unity, accountability, courage, enjoyment and inclusivity.

It changed from a free funded program, into a paid program. Although keeping the fees as low as possible was always priority to ensure all kids growing up in the Territory have access to multi sport.

We often hear the term physical literacy, especially in the school environment. The Australian Sports Comission states that "physical literacy is about building the skills, knowledge and behaviours to lead active lives. It is the holistic learning that gives children physical skills and fitness, attitudes and emotions that motivate you to be active."

The success of Mov3 in the NT has led to the program being rolled out in QLD and VIC, thanks to coach Tim Ellison for his role in establishing a program that caters for the changing sport environment.

It starts with Mov3, but was does it lead to?

Our development camps 3 times per year in the school holidays give our junior members aged 11+ a higher learning experience to further and develop their holisitic knowledge of sport and competition.

Our swimming programs are in high demand and we are faced with the challenge of a lack of available facilities with 2 pools being renovated at the same time.

Coach development is a high priority to ensure we have a workforce to deliver sport programs.

Ensuring learning opportunities are available for those who want to progress their technical knowledge working with the NT Sports Academy, collaborating with other local sports, and our NSO.

7 people in Darwin completed the Foundation coach course to gain their accreditation. We continue to work with those individuals to develop opportunities for a sustainable future in the NT.

We have World Qualifying events on the calendar to ensure Territorian's have a pathway to Age Group World Championships and the Australian Team.



Clubs are the heart and soul of our local opportunites. Support to those volunteer committees is critical in their endeavours not to burn out.

Congratulations to Darwin Tri Club for delivering 18 events. DTC was the second biggest club in Australia with 384 members. An increase after the 21/22 season low of 369, and covid's impact on people to participate in sport and travel. The club had 42% female / 58% male membership.

Congratulations to Katherine Multi sport club for delivering 5 local events. With record participants 300+ in the Ultra Challenge.

Alice Springs Tri Club didn't run anything for the season, we are hoping to work with a new committee in 23/24 for what support they need to continue for the community.

Support annually to the Kakadu Triathlon, delivering sport in remote areas for all people to have access to community events. 96 adults / 30 kids. It raises \$20,000 annually for Care Flight.

50 students from Henbury School participated in the All Abilities triathlon.

Finally, thank you to our inspiring members, coaches, officials, board members, sponsors and volunteers who continue to pour their time and passion into our sport, ensuring that we remain a vibrant and inclusive community.

### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the Association during the financial year were:

- . To act as the peak representative body for Triathlon Clubs in the Northern Territory: and
- To support Triathlon clubs in the Northern Territory in their efforts to conduct the sport of Triathlon.

Under the Future Operating Model (FOM) Service level agreement, operational activities have been outsourced to Triathlon Australia who are responsible for the facilitation and delivery of Triathlon in the Northern Territory.

**The** Northern Territory committee on behalf of its members is monitoring Triathlon Australia's performance against the SLA in terms of operational delivery.

### SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

Triathlon NT signed a Future Operating Model service level agreement under which Triathlon Australia is responsible for implementing the national strategy in accordance with the National Strategic Plan, performing the services in the Northern Territory and promoting, developing, managing, operating, and administering Triathlon throughout the Northern Territory. Under this arrangement the assets and liabilities have been transferred to Triathlon Australia. In addition, the Reserves have been lent to Triathlon Australia. This arrangement has been effective from 1 July 2022 and is for an initial period of three years.

### **OPERATING RESULT**

The result for the year was \$0, (2022: deficit \$29,777).

### STATEMENT BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE

The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity and that this financial report should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the financial statements.

### Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

### Opinion

I have audited the financial report of Triathlon NT Inc, "the Association" which comprises the statement of financial position as of 30 June 2023, the statement profit or loss, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the association's declaration.

In my opinion, the accompanying financial report of Triathlon NT Inc has been prepared so as:

- To give a true and fair view of the financial position as at 30 June 2023 and of the financial performance for the year then ended; and
- b) comply with applicable Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1.

### **Basis for Opinion**

I have conducted the audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of my report. I am independent of Triathlon NT Inc in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to my audit of the financial report in Australia. I have also fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

### Other Information

The directors of the association are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the association's annual report for the year ended 30 June 2023 but does not include the financial report and my auditor's report thereon. My opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly, I do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

### NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Act (NT). The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report covers Triathlon NT Incorporated as an individual entity. The Association is an association incorporated in the Northern Territory under the Associations Act (NT).

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

### **Operating Grants**

Operating grants received are brought to account as income in the period to which the grant relates.

### Revenue

All revenue is stated net of goods and services tax (GST).

### Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue and expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST.

### Property, Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are carried at cost.

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis on all plant and equipment at rates calculated to allocate the cost of the asset against revenue over the estimated useful life of each asset to the Association, as follows:

### **Economic Dependence**

The Association is dependent on government grants and member support for the majority of the revenue to operate its business. The future operations of the Association is dependent on achieving operating surpluses and positive cash flows. At the date of this report, the Management Committee have no reason to believe that the Association will not be able to generate operating surpluses and positive cash flows.

Where required, comparatives have been restated to facilitate meaningful comparison to current year results.
