CODE OF CONDUCT OF BOARD MEMBERS

Introduction

This Code of Conduct (**Code**) has been drafted to address the responsibilities entrusted to the Triathlon South Australia (**TriSA**) Board members. The Code outlines fundamental principles to guide the Board to act in a manner that is fair, ethical and beneficial for **TriSA** and its members and affiliated associations. Each member of the Board must comply with the Code.

A Board member must, at all times:

Strategy

- 1. Strive to achieve the objects of association as outlined in the TriSA Constitution.
- 2. Ensure all TriSA and Board activities are in compliance with the TriSA Constitution, relevant policies, ethical codes and any legislative requirements.
- 3. Participate in the advocacy and promotion of TriSA as an organisation, and remain informed about TriSA's programs and activities.

Personal Behaviour & Integrity

- 4. Act honestly, in good faith in the exercise of his or her duties, for the best interest of the sport of Triathlon.
- 5. Perform the duties of his or her office impartially.
- 6. Exercise the degree of duty of care and diligence in fulfilling the functions of the office and exercising the functions of that office.
- 7. Listen to and respect opinions of fellow colleagues, maintaining courtesy and respect.
- 8. Not do any act or thing which might adversely affect or derogate from the standards, quality and reputation of TriSA and Triathlon and its maintenance and enhancement.
- 9. Not individually instruct the Executive Officer on matters relating to operational issues.
- 10. Properly observe their responsibility as the Executive Officer's employer.

Conflict of Interest

11. Declare any conflict of interest in accordance with the procedures in the TriSA Constitution.

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- 12. Not allow personal interests or the interests of any associated persons, or sectional interests to conflict with the interests of TriSA.
- 13. Not demand or accept in connection with their official duties any fee, favour, reward, gratuity or remuneration of any kind, outside the scope of their entitlements as a Board member, unless authorised by the Chairperson of the Board.
- 14. Not make improper use of information acquired by use of his or her position as a Board member to gain, indirectly or directly, an advantage for himself or herself or for any other person or to cause detriment to the sport.

Confidentiality

- 15. Maintain confidentiality and not divulge information deemed confidential or sensitive. If Board members are uncertain they should seek direction from the Chairperson of the Board.
- 16. Make only proper use of information acquired in their capacity as a Board member.
- 17. Avoid discussing Board or TriSA business in public places.

Responsibilities to Members & Affiliated Associations

- 18. Recognise that the Board's primary responsibility is to act in the interests of the TriSA members and affiliated SA Triathlon Clubs as a whole, but should, where appropriate, have regard for the interests of all stakeholders of Triathlon in South Australia.
- 19. Actively communicate with the TriSA membership and affiliated associations.
- 20. Ensure that TriSA's activities are responsive to the needs and interests of members.
- 21. Assist any members of TriSA who are having administrative, operational and financial difficulties in whatever manner TriSA considers appropriate.

Board Performance

- 22. Be clear and understand the roles, responsibilities and reporting relationships of the Board and professional staff.
- 23. Attend all Board meetings. Where attendance is not possible, Board members must submit an apology. If absence is likely to extend for several consecutive meetings, Board members should obtain a leave of absence.
- 24. Prepare for meetings by:
 - (a) preparing timely and complete reports as required for the member's Board position; and
 - (b) reading and considering papers circulated with the agenda.
- 25. Recognise the authority of the Chairperson of the Board.

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- 26. Debate issues in a non-threatening, co-operative manner at all times.
- 27. Make informed decisions.
- 28. Be independent in judgement and actions, and take reasonable steps to be satisfied as to the soundness of all decisions of the Board.
- 29. Express concerns to the Chairperson or other relevant authority about decisions or actions contrary to the Board's public duty.
- 30. Abide by Board decisions once reached and, once decisions are made, speak with one voice.
