



Resilient racer inspires

TOMAS FINISHES TRIATHLONS

THE word "impossible" doesn't exist in Tomas Klein's vocabulary.

Tomas had his legs amputated at 13 months old, after he was born without tibia bones in his lower legs.

Since the age of 18 months. he's been getting around with prosthetics. But they are not holding him back.

The Brighton Secondary College student, 14, recently completed two triathlons, using a hand cycle for the 10km cycle and carbon fibre prosthetics for the 3km run.

He became the first athlete to compete in the triathlons on carbon fibre legs.

But he said the open water swim was the toughest part.

"I get pretty nervous for the swim because it's the for triathlon organiser first part of the triathlon and sometimes when I can't see the bottom of the sea it can be a bit scary," Tomas said.

His father, Keith Klein, got

him involved in triathlons from age four, when their family went to San Diego to see a triathlon for people with disabilities.

"We wanted Tomas to see that he wasn't the only one with a disability and he's still capable of achieving great things," Mr Klein said.

He said he could not be more proud of his son.

"We often have people we don't even know cheer on Tomas during the triathlon and get other competitors coming over to us saying how Tomas has inspired them," Mr Klein said.

Tomas said his disability frustrated him sometimes.

"It's annoying when my friends go and climb in trees because I can't do it; as much as I want to, I just can't."

Mark Jansen, spokesman SuperSprint, said Tomas was "truly inspiring."

"Tomas exemplifies someone who is pushing himself to the limit," he said.




